

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Editor's Note

This issue of the CIPST marks some significant additions to our editorial board. Marilouise Kroker, who has been the journal's managing editor, is now co-editor of the CIPST. In addition to editing two books on contemporary feminist theory, Body Invaders: Panic Sex in America and Feminism Now: Theory and Practice, she has made an important contribution in transforming the journal into a critical forum for addressing theoretical issues in feminist discourse. Frank Burke, who teaches film studies at Queen's University, has been appointed as the journal's film review editor. Author of a two-book series on Fellini and a theorist with a critical interest in aesthetics and postmodern cinema, his appointment signals the Journal's intention to make cinema criticism and radical film theory an ongoing part of its theoretical analysis. Finally, the editorial board has appointed two book review editors: Professor Daniel Salée (Political Science, Concordia) and Professor Avery Gordon (Sociology, Boston College). While Professor Salée will focus on book reviews in the areas of social theory and political economy, Professor Gordon will concentrate on reviewing in the areas of feminist discourse, postmodern aesthetics, and cultural studies.
